They first became involved with CP Scotland when their nephew Thomas was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at the age of 2. Thomas' parents, Suzanne and Billy, found it difficult to get support for him until they attended Bobath Scotland, as the charity was then known. Ann then experienced the support herself when she attended a parent's session as she was helping to care for Thomas at times to give his parents a break.

I felt like I was hurting him when getting him dressed. Attending the parent session was invaluable it showed me how to correctly put his arm in his t-shirt without causing pain. It gave me confidence and I can only imagine what that does for parents.







When Thomas was 5 the family took part in their first Bike for Bobath and they have been supporting fundraising activities since then, taking part in cycles, Dragon Boat races and the annual ball. Fundraising is very much a family effort and while at first it was all about helping Thomas, now that Thomas is older they want to help other families.
